Howie Newman's new CD: It Sure Beats Working Diverse topics, whimsical lyrics, wide array of styles

Howie Newman's first album in six years features his most diverse song collection ever — in terms of subject matter and style. He delves into interstellar trash collection, politics, baseball, family, the pandemic, modern technology and the music biz.

While telling these intriguing stories, the Boston-area singer-songwriter offers up a nice blend of up-tempo country rock, bluegrass, folk, pop and calypso.

In this mostly acoustic album, Newman showcases his longtime fiddle-playing partner, Joe Kessler, on five of the songs as well as a host of other accomplished local musicians, including keyboard whiz Jim Gambino of the Swinging Steaks. His son, Keith, also lends a hand with some nifty flute playing.

Much like Newman's hilarious concert appearances, five of the tunes are humorous — but three are dead serious. The rest? Probably somewhere in between.

Something old, something new

Among the seven brand-new songs are the title track, a catchy country-rocker, and a percussion-driven Calypso number, "What Did We Do?" There's also "Hannah's Song," a heartfelt look at grandparenthood, with just a touch of humor. Hannah has her own part, too.

The album includes a bluegrass-styled studio remake of his very first recording, "Cosmic Garbageman Rag," a 45 rpm single recorded live in 1976. Newman also provides reworked versions of two other songs from the '70s, "A Little Sympathy" and the baseball classic, "Wait Until Next Year." There's a live version of "Way Past My Bedtime" as well.

Newman's acoustic folk-rock duo, Knock on Wood, tours all over the greater Boston area (including New Hampshire and Maine), performing indoor and outdoor concerts. They'll be playing many of these songs along the way.
